


If you live in Utah, you probably know that the Great Salt Lake is one of the most important geographical features in the state. It has been important for people in the past, and it is important to people today. The Great Salt Lake is big. In fact, it is the largest salt lake in the Western Hemisphere, and the eighth largest salt lake in the world!




The Great Salt Lake is what is left over from a bigger lake that is known as Lake Bonneville, but over thousands of years, the lake got smaller.

Find the Great Salt Lake. It is purple. Lake Bonneville is blue. It was really big compared to the Great Salt Lake.

How Long Would It Take?



If you wanted to drive in a car around the the Great Salt Lake, you would have to start in the early morning right after you wake up and eat breakfast, and you would probably not get home until it was dinnertime. That is a LONG drive. How long would it take to walk that far?

You cannot drink the water from the Great Salt Lake. People and animals need fresh water and it is very hard to find around the lake, especially in the area west of the lake.

Thankfully, there are springs and seeps in some areas. A spring is water that comes from underground and not from on the surface. The animals and people that live in the area know where they are!

Who used to live near the Great Salt Lake a long time ago? Do their grandchildren still live in the area?



We know from evidence found in caves that thousands of years ago the people who lived near the lake in the past were mainly hunters and gatherers. More recently, many Utah Native tribes have lived and still use the resources of the Great Salt Lake. Today the people of these tribes belong to the Ute, the Paiute, the Goshute, and the Shoshone Nations.

The Great Salt Lake area is still home to the Goshute and Shoshone Tribes Notice the tribal lands

Today, two bands of the Goshute tribe live on the south and west side of the lake.

The Northwestern Shoshone people have a tribal office in Brigham City, just north of the lake.

The lake and the land remains important to them.


