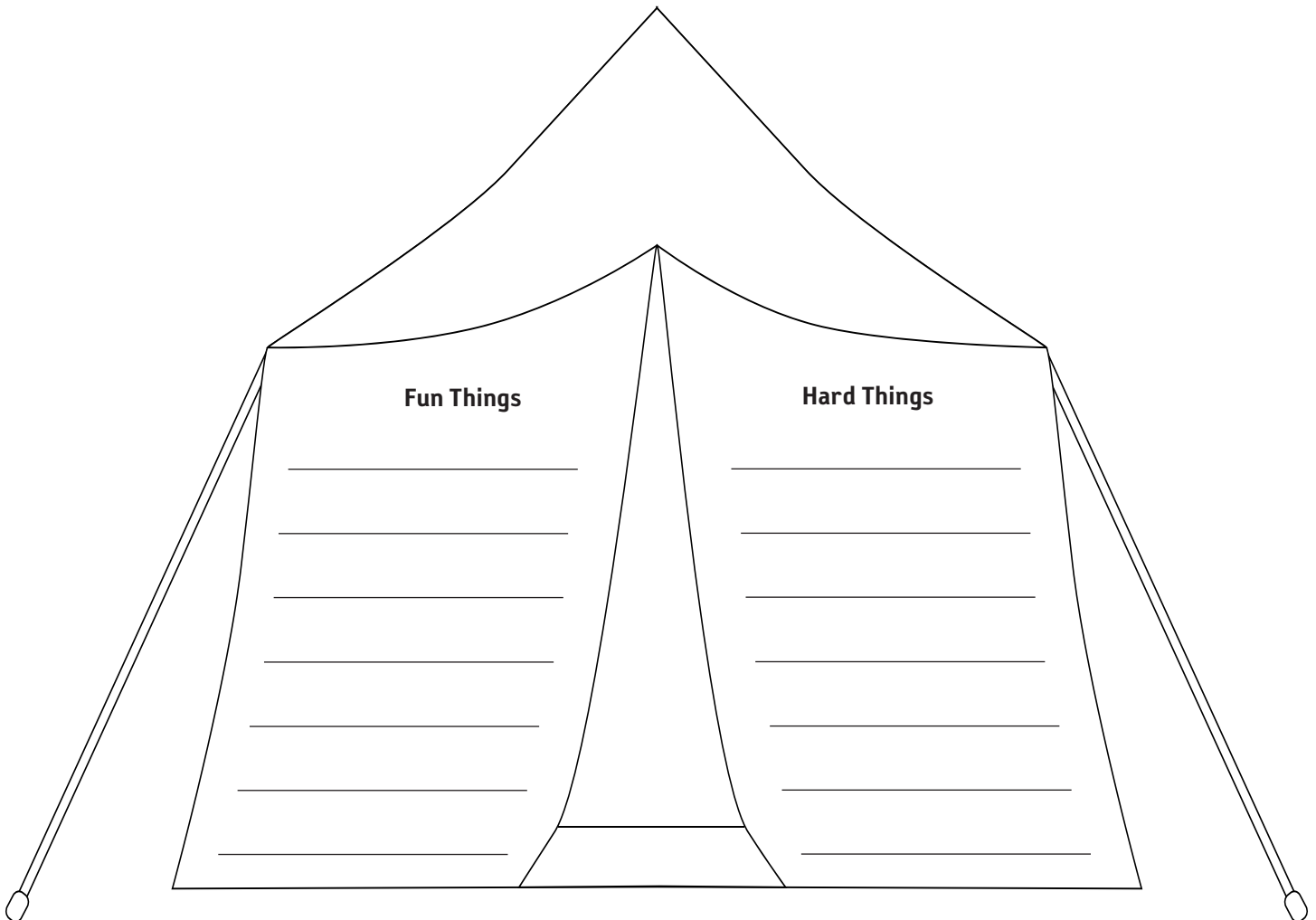


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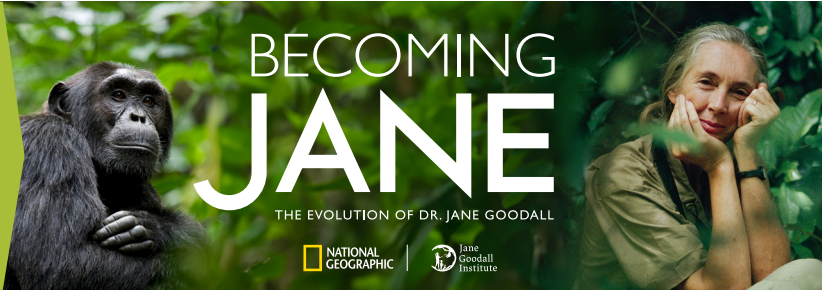


1. Find Jane's favorite childhood toy. What was its name?

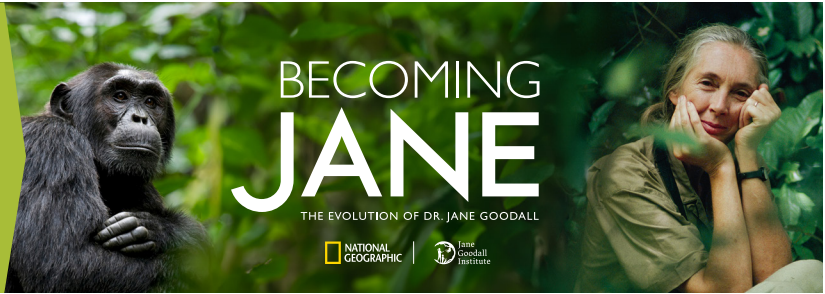
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5. You can be a reason for hope too! How can you help protect chimpanzees?
